<b>TEACHING PROCEDURES</b>		
<p><b>a) communication system:</b> communication channel will be the MICROSOFT TEAMS and the CLASSES. Through these communication systems, each student will receive feedback on their performance, guidance, and exchange of information regarding the contents and activities in the discipline.</p> <p><b>b) distance and face-to-face tutoring model:</b> distance tutoring and four synchronous online tutoring from the teacher.</p> <p><b>c) specific teaching material:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Course guide: didactic material prepared by the teacher.</li><li>2. Video classes: will be produced by the teacher to provide an overview of each topic studied.</li><li>3. Availability of external links: videos or reports related to the topic of each class.</li><li>4. Academic articles.</li><li>5. Required readings.</li></ol> <p><b>d) technological, scientific and instrumental support infrastructure for the discipline:</b> DAGA/UFPR has a computer lab and wireless internet for students who may not otherwise have access; PRAE/UFPR has a computer loan and internet access program for low-income students; through the internet, the student will be able to access the contents, the MICROSOFT TEAMS platform, and the support materials.</p> <p><b>e) period for introducing technological resources:</b> the first week of the course will be dedicated to the first face-to-face meeting to present the program.</p> <p><b>f) frequency control:</b> it is measured by the delivery of designated activities, to which a workload will be assigned. Only ACCESS to the MICROSOFT TEAMS platform will not be counted as presence. There will also be frequency control in face-to-face moments.</p>
